



## Sensory Friendly Performance Social Narrative

We are going to see a play called *The Jungle Book*.

The play is at Kaleideum. Kaleideum is a museum. When we arrive at the museum, we will walk to the lobby.

In the lobby, we will wait for the theater to open. There will be other people waiting in the lobby with us.

When the theatre opens, everyone will go inside! Do we need to use the restroom or get a snack before the play?

We will go in and find our seats. It will be darker in the theater. We get to choose our own seats.

The theater may be crowded. We may walk in front of other people, and other people may walk in front of us to get to a seat. There might be people we don't know sitting near us. We are all here to see the play together.

There are questions and activities in our program that we can read and do together while we are waiting for the show to start.





Before the play begins, a theatre company member will welcome us and introduce the play.

There are four actors in the play. They will all play different characters. The costumes transform to help us know what character they are playing.



The play uses lights and sound to tell the story. The lights and sounds are controlled by a stage manager, who is sitting in the audience with us. The stage manager has a computer that controls the lights.

Some moments may be brighter or louder than the rest of the play. These moments may be a good time to use sunglasses or headphones if it is too exciting.



If we need to leave the theater during the play, that's okay. The house lights will be dim, so that we can still see in the seats. We can come back in when we are ready.

When the play is over, the performers will take a bow. We can clap for the performers before they leave the stage.



When the lights come up over the audience, we can head back out to the lobby and on to our next adventure.
